TITLE OF THE PRACTICE- I

Objectives:

The Practice

The Institution is well aware and concerned about the problems such as poverty, backwardness of the students residing in rural areas. The Management has empowered the College administration to give preference to these students.

Evidence of Success:

In the academic year 2022-23 out of total 3404 students, 56.11% students from rural background has been admitted.

Problems Encountered:

The College is giving priority to the rural students with the aim to enhance their potential, skills, due to the lack of awareness among parents, lack infrastructural facilities, and financial constraints students cannot complete their higher education course.

TITLE OF THE PRACTICE- II

Financial support to needy and deserving students and wards by Institution.

Objectives:

More than fifty percent of the population live below Poverty line and deprived of higher education. The students from such background too deserve opportunity to pursue higher education. The College aims at—

1. To provide financial assistance to such needy students.
2. To facilitate the students to be the part of main stream education system

Context:

More than fifty percentage of the population live below Poverty line and so deprived of higher education. The students from such background also aim at taking higher education. The College aims at providing them opportunity to pursue under graduate and post-graduation studies

The Practice

The Institution has policy to provide financial assistance to poor students and the wards of non-academic staff of the College. For last two decades the students from all streams have been provided with financial help.

Evidence of Success:

For the last three years the College has provided the assistance of Rs 3,80,055 for the academic year 2020-21, Rs 3,76,040 for the academic year 2021-22 and Rs 2,73,949 for the academic year 2022-23 to the students.

Problems Encountered:

Centre as well as state governments have reduced financial aid to the needy students. Due to which students are deprived from such facilities. More and more number of students are approaching the College for more financial help, but the Institution has limitation in providing the help to such students.
