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INTRODUCTION

K. M. Agrawal College of Arts, Commerce & Science, Kalyan, affiliated to University of Mumbai with traditional courses B.A.,B.Com, and B.Sc. College has its vision, mission and objectives which are reflected in our endeavors towards society.

College introduced many UG and PG programmes in emerging fields viz B Sc IT and Computer Science, Bachelor of Management Studies(BMS), B Com in Accounting & Finance and B Com in Banking & Insurance as job oriented courses. Programmes of higher studies viz. M A in History and Economics and M Com, Business Management and Financial Accounting, M.Sc. in Organic Chemistry have been introduced for progression of students to higher studies. College is also having PhD centre for Physics, Commerce and Economics.






The table shows year wise gender classification of male and female percentage of students and the total number of admissions to the College






For post-graduation section the percentage of female students has sharply increase during the year 2016-17 and 2017-18 as compare to 2014-2016.






In Un aided section ,for the year 2015 -16 the percentage of female student belonging to Open Category is 40.96 followed by OBC category which is 20.26%.




The above shows the highest percentage of girl students in Open category which is 38.03. 26.71% of female students are from Hindi Minority category.
